

## Guidance

- 1. A square bracket with a 1 inside represents one marking point [1]
- 2. A forward slash represents an alternative acceptable word or phrase, for example, 'Trees require light/sunlight' [1] means that the word light or sunlight is allowed for the mark.
- 3. <u>Underlined</u> words are required for the mark, for example, 'trees grow because of <u>photosynthesis</u>' [1].
- 4. A bold 'and' means both parts are needed for the mark, for example, 'leaves need carbon dioxide and sunlight [1].
- 5. The phonetic spelling of correct scientific terminology should be credited unless there is a possible confusion with another technical term, for example if the correct answer is 'Biuret test' then 'burette' would not be allowed. However, 'photosintheses' for 'photosynthesis' would be allowed.
- 6. Brackets (.....) are used to indicate information which is not essential for the mark to be awarded, for example '(leaves require) sunlight for photosynthesis [1].

All other guidance is given in the 'guidance notes' section of the mark scheme.
